## NOURISHING OUR NEIGHBORS WITH FOOD AND COMPASSION



My friends, what a journey we have all been through since the spring of 2020. Something as simple as putting a meal on the table became even harder for so many of our neighbors in Mecklenburg Co.

In 2021, we fed 77,140 people—enough to fill Bank of America Stadium. In 2022, that number jumped dramatically to 106,547—enough to fill not only Bank of America Stadium but also The Spectrum Center and Bojangles Coliseum.

Then, just when we thought we had finally begun to see a light at the end of the tunnel, we just experienced the highest August in our 48-year history, feeding 11,947 neighbors a week's worth of groceries. That is a number higher than at the height of the pandemic.

Fortunately, we have not been alone. You, our volunteers, donors and community partners, have been right by our side on the front lines in this fight against hunger and isolation.

We hope you take a moment to read through this Impact Report to see the groceries, meals and hope that YOU made possible.

## A COMMUNITY THAT ACCEPTS NO EXCUSES FOR OUR NEIGHBORS GOING HUNGRY

We depend on an army of volunteers to deliver meals, deliver groceries, sort food donations, pack food boxes and distribute groceries in our pantries and fresh produce at our Pop Up Food Shares.

In 2022, volunteers provided over **70,000 hours of volunteer time, a value of \$2.7 million**, to ensure meals were delivered and pantry shelves were stocked.


Our amazing Social Services Team, Kecia Rutledge & Ileshia Johnson, connected 11,924 of our neighbors to food and additional services.

- » Network of 35+ emergency food pantries in Mecklenburg Co. providing a 7-day supply of nutritionally balanced groceries

# GETTING FOOD WHERE IT'S NEEDED





In March of 2022, we launched our online grocery ordering platform, **Food Storm by InstaCart**. Through this website, our grocery clients can choose the food they would like delivered to their door based on our availability.

Having the ability to choose brings dignity and empowerment for our neighbors. By year's end the program **served 2,300 individuals** and was featured in both local and national news. The program continues to grow!





82%

The meals provided by our Meals On Wheels program are essential to the health and well being of our neighbors. For 71% the food they receive is their main food source for the day.

Volunteers provide human connection for isolated and lonely individuals and peace of mind for their families—allowing homebound individuals to age in place.

**82% report eating healthier** and 79% feel that their overall health status has improved due to the meals they receive from Loaves & Fishes/Friendship Trays.

#### **FOOD PANTRIES**

Provided nutritious groceries to **106,547** neighbors. Almost half were children and seniors.



#### **MEALS ON WHEELS**

Delivered **133,662** nutritiously prepared meals through our Meals on Wheels program.



#### **POP UP FOOD SHARES**

Distributed excess fresh produce and perishable food items to **65,835** neighbors.



#### **GROCERY HOME DELIVERY**

Delivered a week's worth of nutritious groceries directly to the homes of **20,499** neighbors.


